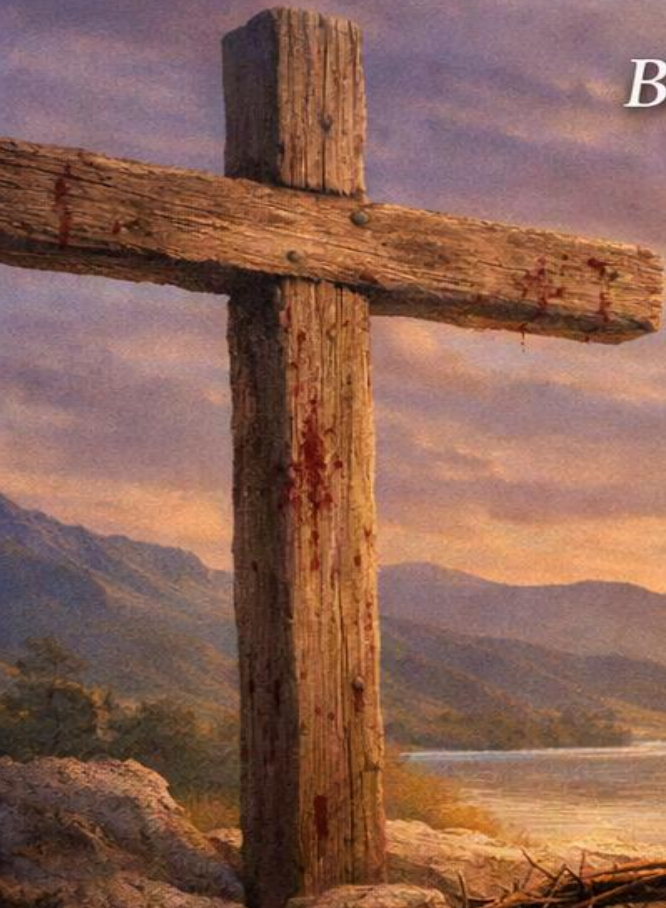




By His *Stripes* We Are *Healed.*

Introduction

Isaiah 53:5 gives us powerful hope that healing is possible through Christ. As we face cancer, we can approach God with faith, believing He can heal physically today. Yet genuine faith also surrenders the outcome to Him. This lesson helps us pray boldly, trust deeply, and remain confident in Christ.



“and with his wounds we are healed”

The verse “and with his wounds we are healed” can give a cancer patient genuine assurance that physical healing can happen now, while still leaving the timing and manner of healing in God’s hands.

Five reasons
PHYSICAL HEALING
can happen now.



1 Christ has authority over sickness.

Jesus demonstrated His authority by healing many diseases during His earthly ministry. His wounds remind us that suffering and sickness are not beyond His power to overcome.



2. God still heals physically today.



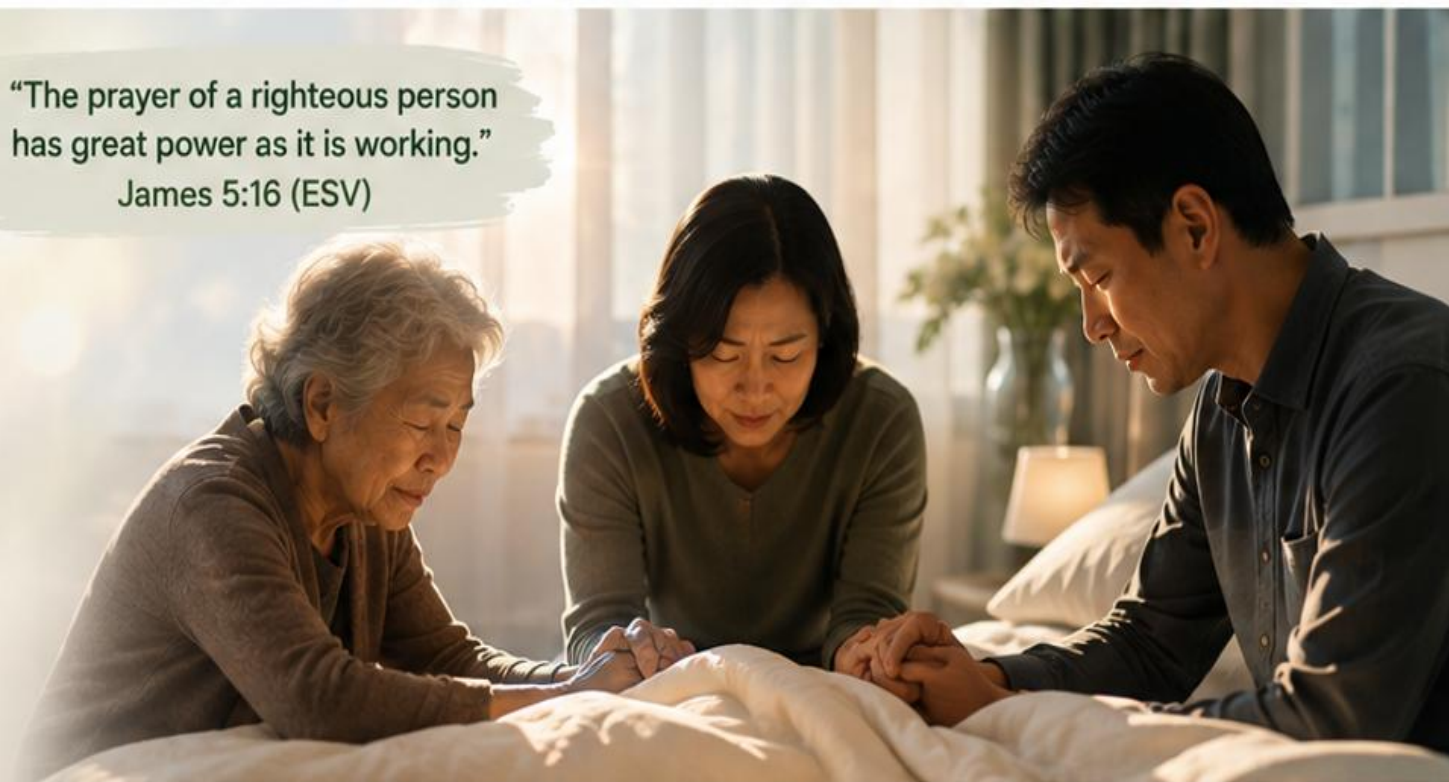
Scripture records believers praying for the sick and expecting God to intervene.



Therefore, Christians can confidently pray for physical healing without presuming that God must heal in exactly the way or timing we expect.

"The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working."

James 5:16 (ESV)



God's timing.



God's way.



God's wisdom.

We trust His perfect plan.

3. “We are healed” gives us permission to approach God with faith.

The present-tense wording can encourage a cancer patient to believe that Christ’s healing power is available now, rather than viewing physical healing as something God could never provide.

4. Prayer can ask boldly while surrendering the outcome.

Faith does not mean demanding healing. It means coming confidently to God, asking Him to heal, trusting His character, and accepting His wisdom concerning the timing and outcome.

Trust His character



Accept His wisdom on timing and outcome

5. Healing ultimately rests on Christ, not our strength.

The assurance comes from His wounds, not the intensity of our faith. We can therefore pray with hope:

“*Lord Jesus, because of what You have accomplished, I believe You can heal me physically. I place my body, treatment, and future in Your hands.*”





Importance of Having a Balanced Understanding

Isaiah 53:5 gives us biblical grounds to pray expectantly for physical healing now, but it does not give us grounds to demand a particular physical outcome from God.



WE CAN PRAY EXPECTANTLY

- God can heal physically
- We have biblical promises
- We can ask with faith and hope

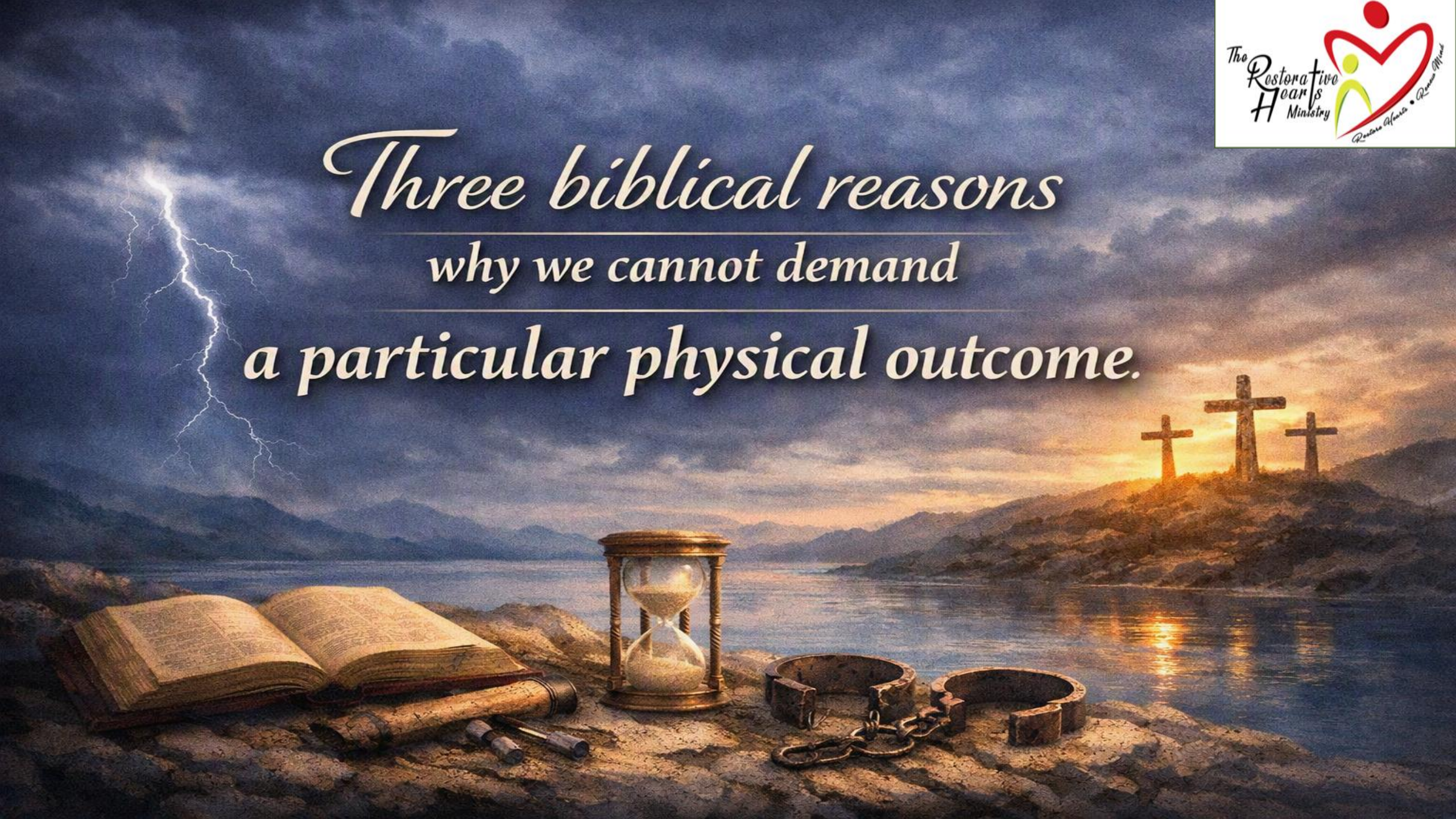


WE DO NOT DEMAND OUTCOMES

- God is sovereign
- He knows what is best
- We trust His will and timing



*Three biblical reasons
why we cannot demand
a particular physical outcome.*



1. God remains sovereign over the outcome.

We can ask boldly for healing, but **God's wisdom is higher** than ours.

Jesus taught us to pray, **"your will be done"** (Matthew 6:10, ESV), showing that prayer involves **trusting God's will**.

God's will is always best.

We trust His wisdom and His perfect plan.



2.

God does not promise that every believer will be physically healed now.



Scripture contains faithful people who continued to suffer despite their faith and prayers.



Paul prayed repeatedly about his “thorn,” yet God chose to give him sufficient grace rather than remove it (2 Corinthians 12:7–9).



God's grace sustains us. His purpose is perfect. We trust Him in every season.

“My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.”

2 Corinthians 12:9 (ESV)



3.

Our faith rests in Christ, not in a guaranteed outcome.

Biblical faith trusts who God is, rather than requiring God to act according to our desired timing or result.

“*Lord, I believe You can heal me,
and I trust You completely,
with what You choose to do.*”

*I trust You,
Lord.*

Your will,
Your timing,
Your way.
You are good.





Understand What Is Biblical Faith

Our confidence is in Christ's power and love, whether healing comes through a miracle, treatment, gradual recovery, or ultimately through resurrection.

Our confidence is in Christ's power and love.



MIRACLE

God can heal supernaturally in an instant.



TREATMENT

God works through doctors, medicine and skilled care.



GRADUAL RECOVERY

God gives strength day by day and leads step by step.



RESURRECTION HOPE

God holds our future and promises eternal life with Him.

Three Conditions **OF THE HEART**

That Prepare Us To
God's Healing





1. A Heart of Faith and Expectation

 Believe that God is able to heal and approach Him with genuine expectation.

 Faith does not demand healing but confidently trusts God's power and goodness.



"I believe; help my unbelief!"

Mark 9:24 (ESV)

Great is our Lord and

2. A Heart of Surrender and Trust

- ♥ Surrender the illness, fears, treatment, and outcome to God.
- ♥ Be willing to **trust His wisdom**, even when His timing or answer differs from what we desire.



*"Trust in the Lord with all your heart,
and do not lean on your own understanding.
In all your ways acknowledge Him,
and He will make straight your paths."*

Proverbs 3:5-6 (ESV)

3. A Heart of Repentance and Openness



Come honestly before God, confessing known sin and releasing bitterness, unforgiveness, fear, or unbelief.



Receive His grace and allow Him to restore the heart as well as the body.



*"Create in me a clean heart, O God,
and renew a right spirit within me."*

Psalms 51:10 (ESV)

An Important Balance To Know

These conditions are **not formulas** that **guarantee** physical healing.

They help prepare the heart to **seek** God sincerely, **receive** His grace, and **pray expectantly** while **trusting** His sovereign will.



We seek His will.
We trust His plan.

The outcome
is in His hands.

*He is always good,
and His plans are
always perfect.*

whatever the outcome.

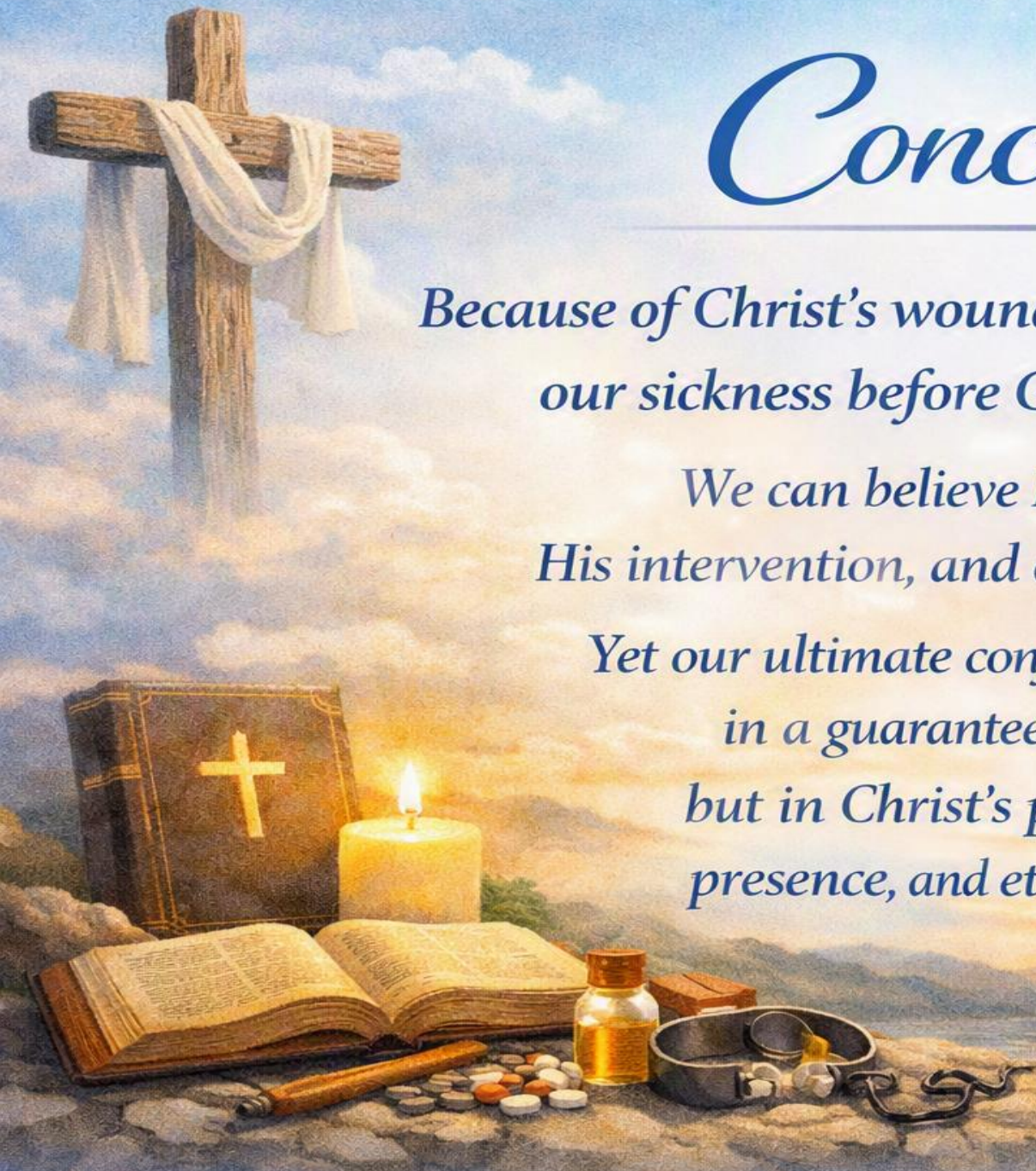
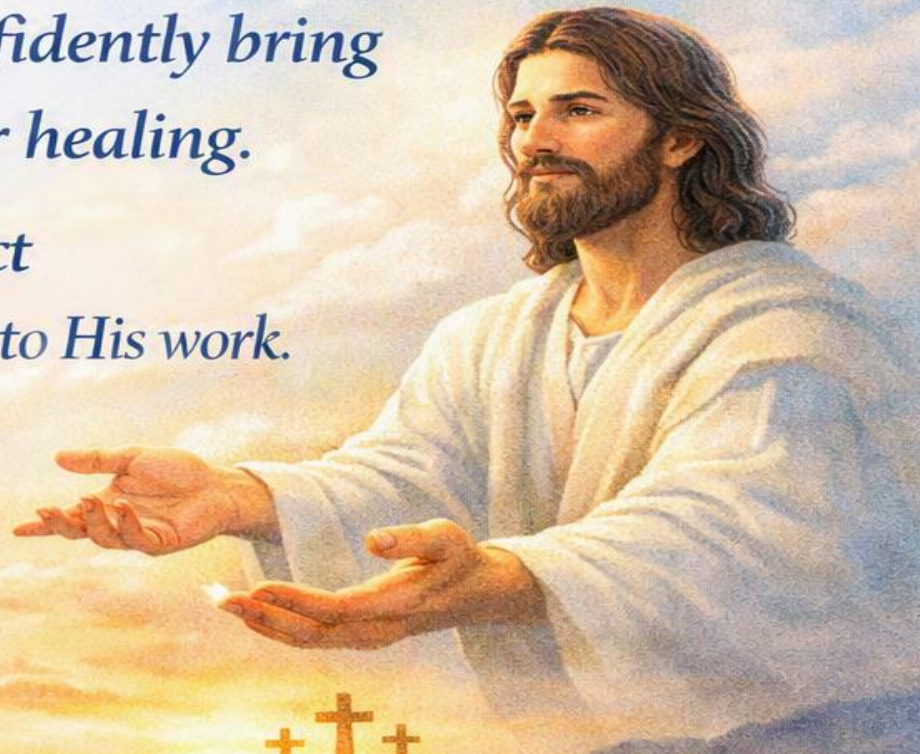


Conclusion

Yet our ultimate confidence rests not in a guaranteed outcome, but in Christ's power, love, presence, and eternal promise.

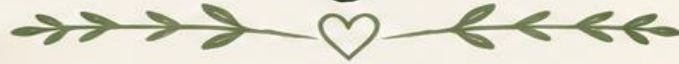


Reflective Question

surrender the outcome.

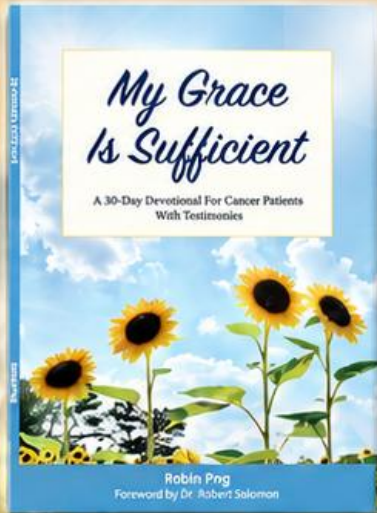

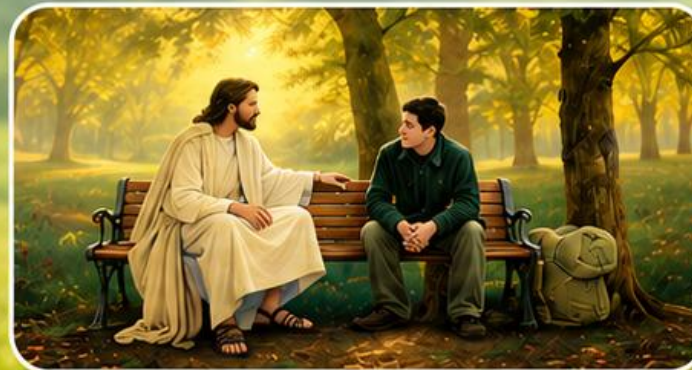
Our Vision
